Dr. Annette Bade earned her undergraduate degree in 1987 from Emory University, after which she completed her optometric training at Southeastern University of the Health Sciences College of Optometry (presently Nova-Southeastern University) in 1993. She accepted the position of instructor at Nova-Southeastern University College of Optometry (NSUCO) in July of 2004.

Dr. Bade spent the first three years after graduation employed at various practice situations including an MD/OD practice, private practices and commercial practices in south Florida. She moved to Texas and focused on private practice employment. Dr. Bade became a Fellow the American Academy of Optometry in 1999. She is a former member of the Board of Directors of the Texas Optometric Association and was honored as the Young Optometrist of the Year in 2000. She served as the chairperson of the Continuing Education committee, the Children's Vision Taskforce and membership section.

Dr. Bade has delivered continuing education case reports covering aspects of primary care. She returned to South Florida in 2002 and accepted a part-time position teaching first and second year NSUCO students Ophthalmic Theory and Methods in lab. She has also served as the clinical research coordinator on several grant-funded studies. In addition to her other responsibilities, Dr. Bade will begin teaching the Clinical Optometric Procedures course this fall.
