

## **Alexandra M. Espejo, O.D. FA.A.O.**



Dr. Alexandra M. Espejo received the title of Optometra from the Universidad de la Salle in Bogota, Colombia in 1992 and her Doctor of Optometry degree from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1996. She completed a Residency in Primary Care at Nova Southeastern University following graduation. Additionally, Dr. Espejo completed a Chief Residency at Nova Southeastern University and then became a full-time faculty member in August of 1999.

As a faculty member at Nova Southeastern University, Dr. Espejo has served in the Primary Care and Cornea and Contact Lens Clinics in Davie, Fort Lauderdale and North Miami Beach. Dr. Espejo served as co-coordinator for the Optometric Theory and Methods (OTM IV) Laboratory in the 2000 spring semester. She has served in the OD2 Proficiency committee, Clinic Manual committee, Quality Assurance committee and Student Affairs committee. She has also served in the Faculty Executive Council as vice chair 2001-02 and chair 2002-03. Dr. Espejo continued her participation in the Residency Program as a Resident Supervisor and Residency Education Coordinator. She works closely in the day-to-day administration of the program and is responsible for the coordination of clinical assignments and schedules of the residents. In May of 2000, Dr. Espejo became the Module 3 Director in the OD3 Primary Care Clinic.

Dr. Espejo has participated in continuing education laboratories for fundus evaluation during the Ocular Therapeutics and Management of Ocular Disease Course at Nova Southeastern University. She has presented posters at the annual meetings of the American Academy of Optometry and at the Southeastern Congress of Optometry. She has also lectured in a bachelor/master program for Spanish optometrists in Madrid Spain on July 2002 and January 2003. She is a member of the American Optometric Association, Florida Optometric Association and Dade County Optometric Association for which she served as Board Trustee. Dr. Espejo became a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry in 2002.

Current teaching activities include primary care clinic as well as residency supervision. As module 3 director she lectures for module conference once a week.
