

Alan G. Kabat, OD, FAAO



Dr. Kabat is an honors graduate of Rutgers University (1986) and the Pennsylvania College of Optometry (1990). He completed his residency training in hospital-based optometry and ocular disease at John F. Kennedy Memorial Hospital in Philadelphia (1991). Dr. Kabat currently holds the rank of Associate Professor, and also serves as Director of Residency Programs for the College.

Dr. Kabat is a prolific author of papers, posters, and other publications in the area of ocular and oculosystemic disease. He is most well known in the literary arena as a co-author of **The Handbook of Ocular Disease Management** and as a Contributing Editor for **Review of Optometry** and the weekly e-journal, **Optometric Physician**. In addition to writing, Dr. Kabat lectures frequently at the local, national, and international levels. He has been invited to speak in numerous venues in regions throughout the world, including Canada, Central America, Europe, and Africa.

Dr. Kabat has been recognized as a Fellow of both the American Academy of Optometry (1996) and the Prentice Society (1998). He has worked with the National Board of Examiners in Optometry since 1993. He is an active member of the Florida Optometric Association, the American Optometric Association, and the Southern Council of Optometrists.

Current Teaching Responsibilities: Dr. Kabat is currently the instructor of record for the course in Clinical Medicine, as well as a laboratory instructor for the Physical Diagnosis course. In addition, he guest lectures frequently in numerous courses within the ocular disease track. Dr. Kabat is regularly scheduled as an attending physician in both the primary care clinics and Residents' clinic. He further serves as the coordinator of the newly established Urgent Care Service and after-hours Emergency Service for The Eye Institute.
