

## Lewis Reich



Dr. Lewis Reich graduated with his optometry degree from University of California at Berkeley in 1988. Following graduation, Dr. Reich completed a residency in low vision rehabilitation at the Pennsylvania College of Optometry and went on to serve briefly as a faculty member and researcher. In 1991, Dr. Reich entered the graduate program in physiological optics at the University of Houston and soon after joined the faculty as a Research Assistant Professor. Dr. Reich earned his Ph.D. in Physiological Optics in 1999. Also in 1999, he joined the faculty of Nova Southeastern University, College of Optometry, where he holds the rank of Associate Professor. Dr. Reich's research has been funded by grants from the National Eye Institute as well as the National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research. He has had over a dozen peer-reviewed publications and has presented his research at two dozen national and international meetings. Dr. Reich is an active manuscript reviewer for major optometric and vision science journals.

Dr. Reich became the Assistant Dean for Student Affairs at the College of Optometry in 2003. He currently teaches the Visual Optics course and is an instructor in the Optometric Theory and Methods (OTM) laboratories. He also guest lectures in the Low Vision course and teaches in the primary care and low vision clinics. Dr. Reich actively mentors optometric faculty in all aspects of clinical research as well as pursuing his individual projects.
