Dr. Lori Vollmer earned her undergraduate degree from the University of South Florida in 1990. Following graduation, she worked as a certified ophthalmic technician for eight years until pursuing a career in optometry in 1998. She graduated with honors and distinction from Nova Southeastern University College of Optometry in 2002. She completed a residency in ocular disease at the Aran Eye Associates in Miami, Florida in July 2003.
