

## **Primary Care with emphasis in Pediatrics**

The NSU Residency in Primary Care seeks to attract the best-qualified optometric graduates and to provide them with advanced didactic and clinical education in clinical optometry. The program offers a variety of optometric and interdisciplinary care and is designed to foster a life-long commitment to learning. Graduates of this residency program are trained to deliver superlative clinical care in primary care optometry, to serve as optometric educators, and to serve the profession of optometry as leaders in the community and within the health care delivery system.

The Primary Care with *emphasis* in Pediatrics residency position offers additional clinical and didactic training in the areas of primary care of the pediatric patients as well as the specialty areas of infant vision, binocular vision, strabismus, amblyopia, special populations, head trauma, visual perception, vision therapy and pediatric eye disease. The resident will spend approximately 60% of their clinical training in primary care and 40% of their clinical training in pediatrics and binocular vision.
